STATE CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROFILE

HIGHLIGHTS

In Michigan, Byrne JAG state funding has assisted with numerous innovative initiatives and supports:

- Twenty-two task forces serving the state's 83 counties. Task forces are made up of leadership from the Michigan State Police and staffed by local law enforcement from participating cities and counties. To support these multijurisdictional efforts, Byrne JAG funds provide for 7 full-time Michigan crime lab employees who work on processing evidence and reducing case backlog. In addition, Byrne JAG funds pay for 2 crime analysts who help ensure coordination across the state, ensure information sharing across task forces, and improve how/where enforcement resources are allocated. All of these efforts are focused on ensuring that investigations are targeting violent offenders.
- Michigan's Secure Cities Partnership (SCP), which works to reduce crime and increase the quality of life in 4 Michigan cities (Detroit, Flint, Pontiac, and Saginaw) that are most heavily impacted by violent crime. As part of this effort, the Michigan State Police initiated directed patrols in all 4 sites using real-time crime data and analytics. Using evidence-based data-driven approaches to crime and the traffic safety program, the state police force is working with local law enforcement to enhance its ability to use data, mapping, and analytics to inform its enforcement strategies. Directed patrols have had an immense impact on each SCP site, with each city reporting drops in crime.

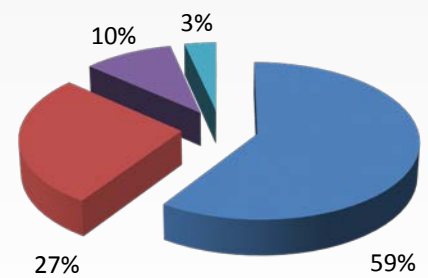
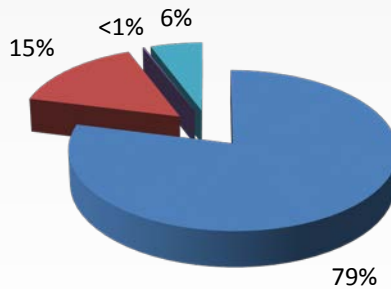

OFFICER FATALITIES AND ASSAULTS

Between 2004 and 2013, 17 officers were feloniously killed (1 in 2013) and 12 officers were accidentally killed in the line of duty. In 2013, 921 officers were assaulted (1.85% of all officers assaulted in the United States).
